This seminar focuses on researcher development, placing both students and academics on the same continuum of the *Researcher Skill Development (RSD7)* framework. This conceptual model enables PhD supervisors as well as early and mid-career career researchers to identify strengths and weaknesses for HDR students as well as for themselves and for research teams. But it also may inform the teaching of undergraduate and masters-by-coursework students, in ways that relate to the design of curricula to enable the development of skills associated with research in a discipline or in cross-disciplinary ways. The Researcher Skill Development framework then conceptually spans academia from the First Year student to established researcher.

This seminar will honour the tradition of enabling discussions over a delicious breakfast, first outlining the RSD7 in order that you may identify issues of importance with your colleagues.
