CURRENT RESEARCH WORK

I continue to work mainly on the religious and ethnic minorities of India and China, with particular reference to questions of marginalisation, mass poverty and the implications of this for regional and human security. I remain strongly committed to multi-disciplinary research and inter-country comparisons, hence my current focus on Bombay city in India and Kashgar in western China.

Throughout my career, I have been informed by my original training as an economic historian- so I am interested in long term trends, the evolution of economic institutions and long term economic growth and development issues in India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Malaysia and China. This engagement has led me to write about the evolving nature of the private sector in these countries, with a particular focus on company case studies. Some of these case studies pertain to the entrepreneurship of religious and ethnic minorities.

I also strongly believe in encouraging young scholars to publish their research work and have, over the years, co-published papers with a number of my doctoral students on subjects of mutual interest.
