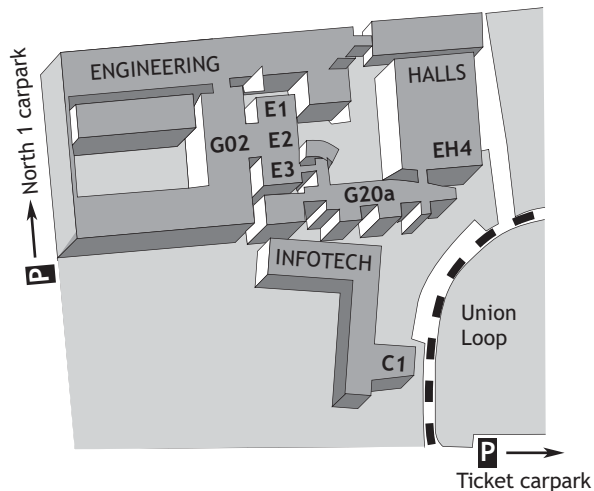


EET Conference Map
