## The Picasso Fiasco

**Picasso: Love & War**

1935 – 1945

A new CHEMystery for 2006. The School of Chemistry, Monash University, in collaboration with the National Art Gallery of Victoria, announces the launch of the 2006 CHEMystery: The Picasso Fiasco.

The all-day program will be held on each of the 10th, 13th and 14th of July 2006. Students will arrive at the National Art Gallery of Victoria in the morning for a lecture on Picasso, Art and Forensic Chemistry. A brief morning tea will then precede entry into the collection. After viewing the "Picasso: Love & War 1935-1945" exhibition, students will be bussed to Monash University for the remainder of the program. After lunch, the mystery will unfold, and students will be required to work in groups in the laboratory to solve the mystery surrounding one of Picasso's most famous works. Results will then be presented to Judge Judy. Will the students be able to prove to Judge Judy that their solution is correct? Once the Judge has handed down her verdict, the day concludes with a guest lecturer, an expert in the field of art authentication, pizza and the bus trip home.

It will be a fun filled day of art, science, and forensic investigation!
