Monash gears up for move to new Malaysia campus

Monash University Malaysia will move into a new purpose-built campus in 2007. The first phase will see the construction of six buildings able to accommodate almost 5,000 students and some 500 staff. In phase two, the University's capacity will be increased to between 8,000 to 10,000 students.



The first phase of new Monash campus in Malaysia is a \$61m investment

The University's School of Medicine and Health Sciences was the first unit to move into the new campus in January. The remaining schools and administrative personnel are expected to shift into the new campus by June.

Human *Writes* Essay Competition 2007

For Victorian Year 11 and 12 students

Due date: Friday 13 April 2007

This is the competition's second year. In 2007, students are asked to write between 750 and 1,000 words and tackle the following current and controversial human rights topic:



"Freedom of speech has gone too far"

The aim of the essay is to engage students in legal debate through current human rights, social and political issues.

Students may argue for or against the statement, or can elect to examine both sides of the issue. Essays should convey the student's viewpoint effectively and concisely and can focus on specific issues within the topic or more broadly across the issue.

A range of awards will be available for outstanding essays including:

- 1st prize - \$1000
- 2nd prize - \$500
- 3rd prize - \$250

Berwick campus accommodation

- Berwick Residential is located on the Berwick campus and is a two-minute walk from main academic buildings
- Berwick Residential can house around 144 residents and includes of the Halls of Residence, North Flats and a communal Pavilion Building.

Halls of Residence

- The Halls opened in March 2006 with modern collegiate style accommodation for up to 114 residents
- The Halls offer both single ensuite rooms and apartment-style accommodation
- Single ensuite rooms have their own private bathrooms and access to communal self-catering kitchens and living spaces
- Apartments have four bedrooms and shared self-catering kitchen, living area, bathroom and toilet.

North Flats

- The North Flats are six furnished flats accommodating 30 students.
- The five-bedroom flats are located at the northern end of the campus and are suited to second-and-higher year students with greater privacy and minimal supervision.
- All bedrooms are single and residents share the facilities including a self-catered kitchen, living areas, two bathrooms and toilets and free laundry facilities.

Pavilion Building

- This is the communal building for Berwick Residential.
- It houses a free laundry for the students living in the Halls and recreational facilities such as TV, DVD, table tennis, pool and kitchen facilities
